Key Terms



SAP Fieldglass is an external workforce management tool that will be used to manage all service procurement and contractor management. As such, it is important to become familiar with Fieldglass terminology.

Service Provider is any organization that performs a service or provides a contracted workforce to Suncor (formerly referred to as a supplier or contractor).

Statement Of Work (SOW) Service Provider is an organization that provides / delivers / executes third-party contracted services to Suncor. This is the most common type of service provider within Fieldglass. SOW includes a broad range of services such as: construction, maintenance, repairs, transportation, lodging, rentals, consulting, and much more.

Master Statement of Work (MSOW) is the Fieldglass term for contract.

The **MSOW** includes contract type details such as: the owner, budgets, site locations, terms and conditions, and rates.

Statement Of Work (SOW) is the term used by Fieldglass for a purchase order. It constitutes an agreement between Suncor and a supplier for the provisioning of services.

SOW Fee is the summary of charges billed to Suncor for any service provided that does not require worker-based time entry.

SOW Worker is an individual worker provided by a service provider who is not reflected in Suncor's organization (org) chart. Billing for SOW Workers is entered using DTE.

Detailed Time Entry (DTE) and its importance



Key suppliers of onsite labour and maintenance at Suncor site locations will be required to support the process of DTE within SAP Fieldglass

What is DTE?

- DTE is a process by which labour, maintenance and/or equipment charges are itemized by worker, work date, cost object, and/or service provided.
- Multiple lines may be required in Workday to accommodate different shift differentials (e.g., regular vs. overtime), or charges being submitted for a worker who is working across multiple jobs / work orders on a given day.

Why is this detail important?

- **Cost Flow** Capturing costs at the work order or cost object level is important to ensure costs are allocated and accounted for against the correct asset.
- Planning and scheduling Detailed time capture of working hours by resource allows tracking of actuals against resource planning. This allows for better planning for future maintenance requirements. Timely entry enables adaptive replanning of work, especially for events of longer duration.
- Asset Down Time Accurate planning and execution allows Suncor to minimize asset downtime.
- Validation and Compliance Detailed entry enables system validation of contracted rates, as well as real-time attestation of charges. This avoids audit issues and recoveries.

Roles and Responsibilities of a Service Provider



Key responsibilities within Fieldglass include the following:

- View and action MSOW and SOW
- Add a SOW Worker to SOWs
- Submit a SOW Fee or SOW Worker time
- Reconcile billing and payments
